## Seagull

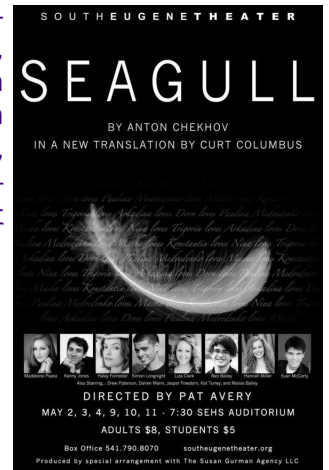
